Isaiah 10:1-2

The Charges

1 Woe to the ones decreeing oppressive decrees, and who are writing injustices *which* they have written;

2 To turn aside the needy from legal claim, and to rob the judgment of the poor of my people, for widows to be their prey, and *to* rob the orphans!

Isaiah 10:3

The Challenge

3 And what will you do in the day of visitation, and in the storm *which* shall come from far? Upon whom will you flee for help? And where will ye deposit your glory?

Isaiah 10:4

The Consequences

4 Without me they will bow down under the prisoners, and they will fall under the slain. In all this his anger is not turned away, and his hand *is* stretched out still.

Isaiah 10:5-34

The Indignation of God upon Judah

Isaiah 10:5

The Control of God

5 Woe Assyrian, the rod of my anger, and the staff in their hand is my indignation.

Isaiah 10:6

The Commission of God

6 I will send him against a godless nation, and against the people of my wrath will I give him command, to take the spoil *as* spoil, and to

plunder the prey, and to make them a treading down like the mire of the streets.

Isaiah 10:7

The Contrary Intentions

7 And he intends not in this way, and his heart does not think in this way; but *it is* in his heart to destroy and cut off nations not a few.

Isaiah 10:8-11

The Confession of Sennacherib

8 Because he says, *Are* not my princes altogether kings?

9 *Is* not Calno like Carchemish? *is* not Hamath like Arpad? *Is* not Samaria like Damascus?

10 As my hand obtained the kingdoms of the gods, and whose idols are more than of Jerusalem and of Samaria;

11 Shall I not, as I have done to Samaria and her gods, so will I do to Jerusalem and her idols?

Isaiah 10:12-15

The Confident Boasting

12 And it will be, when the Lord has performed his whole work upon the Mountain of Zion and upon Jerusalem, I will punish the fruit of the great of the heart of the king of Assyria, and upon the splendor of his high looks.

13 Because he said, In the strength of my hand I have done *it*, and by my wisdom; because I have understanding; and I have removed the boundaries of the people, and I have completely robbed their wealth, and I have brought down the ones dwelling like a mighty *man*:

14 And my hand found as a nest the wealth of the people: and as one gathers eggs *that are* left, I have gathered all the earth; and there was none that flutters the wing, or opened the mouth, and chirped.

15 Shall the axe boast itself above the one cutting with it? *Or* shall the saw exalt itself over the one moving it back and forth? As if the rod should wield *itself* over the ones lifting it up *or* as if the staff should lift up *itself*, as if it were not wood.

Isaiah 10:1-34

Literal English Translation

Isaiah 10:16-19

The Consumption of the Assyrians

16 Therefore shall the Lord, Yahweh of hosts, send among his fat ones leanness; and under his glory he shall kindle a burning as the burning of a fire.

17 And the light of Israel shall have been for a fire, and his Holy One for a flame: and it will burn and devour its underbrush and its thorn bushes in one day;

18 And will consume the glory of his forest, and of his orchards, both soul and flesh: and they shall have been as when a standard-bearer faints.

19 And the rest of the trees of his forest shall be few, and a child will write them.

Isaiah 10:20-23

The Covenant of God

20 And it will be in that day, the remnant of Israel, and the ones who are escaped of the house of Jacob, shall no longer continue leaning upon the one striking them; but shall lean upon Yahweh, the Holy One of Israel, in truth.

21 The remnant shall return, *even* the remnant of Jacob, to the God of might.

22 Because if your people Israel be as the sand of the sea, a remnant among them shall return: the consumption decreed shall be overflowing righteousness.

23 Because the Lord Yahweh of hosts shall make consumption, even decreed, in the midst of all the land.

Isaiah 10:24-27

The Comfort of God

24 Therefore in this way has said the Lord Yahweh of hosts, my people who are dwelling in Zion, Do not be afraid of the Assyrian: he will strike you with a rod, and shall lift up his staff against you, in the way of Egypt.

25 Because yet a very little while, and the indignation will cease, and my anger upon their destruction.

Isaiah 10:1-34

Literal English Translation

26 And Yahweh of hosts shall lay bare a scourge upon him like the wounding of Midian at the rock of Oreb: and as his staff was upon the sea, and he will lift it up in the way of Egypt.

27 And it will be in that day, his burden shall be cut off from upon your shoulder, and his yoke from upon your neck and the yoke shall be destroyed because of the anointing.

Isaiah 10:28-32

The Coming of Sennacherib

28 He was come upon Aiath, he was passed through Migron; at Michmash he stored his armor:

29 And have passed over the passage: they have pitched their tent at Geba; Ramah is terrified; Gibeah of Saul has fled.

30 Carry up your voice, O daughter of Gallim: cause your voice to be heard unto Laish, O poor Anathoth.

31 Madmenah has fled; the ones dwelling in Gebim gather themselves to flee.

32 Yet he will remain at Nob that day: he shall shake his hand *against* the mountain of the daughter of Zion, the hill of Jerusalem.

Isaiah 10:33-34

The Conclusion

33 Behold, the Lord, Yahweh of hosts, will lop off the branches in terror: and the great ones of stature *shall be* cut down, and the high shall be brought low.

34 And it shall be cut down the undergrowth of the forest with an ax, and Lebanon will fall in its splendor.
