

LESSON FIVE

THE GREEK ALPHABET - Part 5

In this lesson you will learn the final four letters of the alphabet. You will be learning these letters by rhyme just as you did for the three letters in Lesson Two.

The names of the letters are as follows:

φ phi (fee)

χ chi (key)

ψ psi (psee)

and the final letter

ω omega (oh-meh-gah)

<u>GREEK LETTER</u>	<u>LETTER NAME</u>	<u>LETTER PRONUNCIATION</u>	<u>PRINTED FORM</u>
φ	phi (PHee)	"PH" as in PPhone	
χ	chi (CHee)	"CH" as in CHemistry	
ψ	psi (PSee)	"PS" as in tiPS	
ω	omega (OH-meh-gah)	"OH" as in note	

You should learn the order of these letters according to the rhyme of their names. The Lesson Five exercises will help you learn to write and pronounce them.

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
EXERCISE ONE

WRITING & PRONUNCIATION EXERCISES


After you learn the order of the three Greek letters by rhyme and the final letter in Lesson 5, you should learn the writing and pronunciation of them by using the exercises below.

Write each letter in printed form and at the same time verbally pronounce its name and sound. For example, the first letter will be PHI (ϕ). Write the letter in printed form and while writing the letter say, "PHI, PH." You should say the name "PHI" when you begin to write the circle part of the letter and the pronunciation "PH" during your final down stroke.


Your practice paper should look like this:
